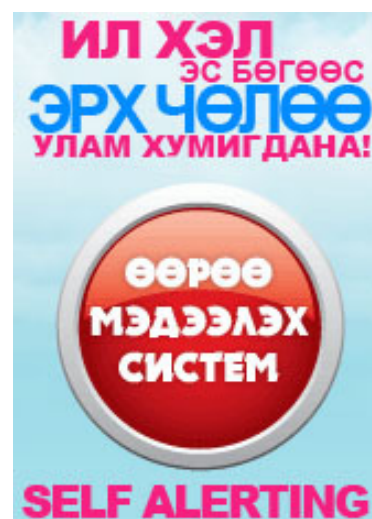
3.1. Monitoring/Studies/Researches

3.1.1 Monitoring Free Expression Violations

Globe International has been monitoring free expression violations since October 2005 under OSI Network Media Program and OSF, Mongolia. In May 2010, Globe International has launched a new two-year project with goal to protect the rights and independence of journalists by monitoring threats and attacks on journalists and media organizations thus contributing to promoting greater media freedom.

We used to have 22 monitors based in Ulaanbaatar and 21 provinces and in 2010, a new online monitoring system was created in order to allow the journalists to directly approach Globe International for reporting on their cases. www.globeinter.org.mn/selfalerting

We have been promoting the new system through flyers, e-mailing list, website, bi-monthly webzine: Globe News and various training and events organized by Globe International.

In 2010, we worked on the cases such as threats against five media outlets and journalists, five civil and criminal defamation cases brought to the courts.

On December 22, 2010, we convened the press conference at the Mongol News company's Press Conference Hall to release our statement on the Zuunii Medee newspaper's case which is sued by one of the rich businessman. The daily newspaper published a series of articles in human trafficking.

Globe International provides free legal consultancy for the journalists and in 2010, eight journalists and media outlets received the assistance from Globe International lawyers G.Davaakhuu and D.Munkhburen.

3.1.2 The following two studies carried out within the project Enabling Legal Environment for Free and Independent Media under the Asia Foundation grant:

- **Comparative Study on Media Ownership and Concentration.**

Study conducted by M. Dorjkhanda, a lawyer. Purpose of the study was to look at how media ownership and concentration impacts the media independence and to raise awareness of the public, media community and decision makers on legal regulations for optimal ratio of media ownership and concentration, thus ensuring fair and transparent media environment that is desired for good governance and strengthening of democracy in the country.

Media ownership and its transparency are on the widely discussed issues in the society and media

concentration is on-going process in Mongolia. The lawyer reviewed regulations of Australia, France, Germany USA, Netherlands, Italy and Great Britain as well as the present Mongolian legislation. Specifics of regulations introduced by the European Union and Europarliament also were learned as international standard. Report on the comparative study provides terminology and definitions of the media ownership and concentration.

Based on the findings, report includes recommendations to enable legal environment for the media ownership and concentration.

- **Comparative study on Editorial Independence**

Study conducted by M.Batsuuri, a lawyer and was aimed at increasing awareness and knowledge about the editorial independence among lawyers, media practitioners and human rights NGOs with in immediate objectives to research practices of international regulations and legislation and develop recommendations for improving legal environment.

Study involved national laws and regulations having positive or negative impact on the editorial independence and regulations of Scandinavian countries and Portugal as well Russia, Georgia and Macedonia – in contrary, tried to adopt specific regulations on editorial independence. In most countries “Code of professional conduct” for journalists is adopted and it serves as binding rules for all media workers and watchdog organizations are in place for

cases of breaches of this Code. Editorial independence is usually reflected in these codes in the form of protection of journalistic professional activities and the journalistic content from the sources of financing.

3.1.3 Ant-corruption legislative score card

In the framework of the Asia Foundation-funded project “Integrity Star”, we conducted a monitoring on the votes of MPs on anti-corruption legislation that passed by the Parliament between 2008 and 2010. Prior the monitoring D. Saranchimeg, a lawyer compiled the list of laws related anti-corruption including laws and law provisions supporting government transparency. In total, 20 laws and law on amendments were enacted. The monitoring team worked in the Parliament library and reviewed the memos of seven Parliament sessions held for 154 days and seven activity reports issued by the Parliament.

In 2008-2010, the Parliament passed in total 534 laws and resolutions. The findings showed that no laws and policy documents directly looking into the corruption passed by the Parliament, but 14 laws, five law amendments and 14 Parliamentary Resolutions were enacted to improve the mechanism for the government accountability, and responsiveness and to promote justice. The team selected nine laws and involved to the scorecard.

The main obstacle on the monitoring process was that team was not allowed to access the voting results, even it is not secret information by the Mongolian laws. Then Globe International sent an official letter to Mr. Ts.Sharavdorj, head of Parliament Office Parliament seeking support in information gathering.

Unfortunately, it was not allowed, therefore, on October 27, 2010, we sent the official letters to 76 MPs requesting to access the records of the voting. We received the answers from only three MPs: Kh.Temuujin, Ts.Sedvanchig and Ts.Munkh-Orgil permitting to access to their voting records. Finally, we succeeded in getting the voting records after Globe International leader met Mr. D.Demberel, Speaker of Parliament on December 1, 2010.

The Monitoring report sent to the Asian Foundation for review and it will be publicized next year through a press conference.

3.1.4 Globe International works on two surveys as a part of our project “Transparency Campaigning at Local Government to Curb Corruption funded by the Partnership for Transparency Fund

- **Corruption Perception Survey**

Corruption perception survey among 120 citizens of the two soums: Guchin-Uus of Ovorkhangai aimag and Bayankhutag of Khentii aimag conducted by the two aimag NGOs, members of the anti-corruption network of the Independent Authority of Anti-Corruption and the reports will be available in February 2011 and presented to the round tables in March 2011.

- **Monitoring on Local Transparency**

The monitoring on the local administration transparency started in the two soums: Guchin-Uus of Ovorkhangai aimag and Bayankhutag of Khentii aimag. The contracts with the monitoring team leaders signed. The Code of Ethics accepted by each member of the monitoring team who trained by Globe International. 3.1.5 In the frame of Business Roaming project the following research activities carried out:

- **Business directory**

Project team completed a Business directory in March 2010 which contains the general prospects and detailed contacts of SMEs, companies, cooperatives, groups and NGOs of Ulaanbaatar and 8 aimags. The directory also includes an introduction of productions and activities of SMEs, companies, cooperatives, groups and NGOs working to support the business and rural development. The readers can access information on 362 companies and SMEs located in none districts of Ulaanbaatar and 21 provinces that work in the fields of meat, milk and skin products, wool and cashmere and tourism.

- **Impact survey on radio programs**

The research team lead by T.Batzorig completed the impact survey in March 2010 on twenty-minute radio series aired by the National Public Radio “Herder of Modern Era” from January 2009 to 30 June 2010 and a series “Way of Success” aired by 8 local radio stations during the project implementation. The survey was conducted in four aimags: Khentii, Umnugovi, Uvurkhangai and Khuvsgul and involved 100 herders and 700 SMEs and unemployed residing in the target aimags.

The results showed that 46% of the rural residents listen to “Herder of Modern Era” and 12.3%- “Way of success”. Each of five listeners of “Herder of Modern Era” received information and news important to support their businesses while only 1% of “Way of Success” listeners said the same. It concludes that the percentage of the radio listeners is low, especially local radio reach is not sufficient. While television is the main information source for 68.9% of herders’ families. . BIA

should to take into consideration that 46% of the herders have considered that TV version of “Herder of Modern Era” would be more effective.

3.2. 2010 Events

3.2.1. World Press Freedom Day

“May 3- The World Press Freedom Day. For the Right to Know” event was held at Puma Imperial Hotel and we publicized the 2009 Media Freedom Report and handed over the Media Freedom Award to two female journalists Kh. Namuun-Uyanga, chief-in-editor of Oglloonii sonin, daily and B. Myagmarsuren, Chief-in-Editor, Zavkhan newspaper, provincial weekly.



The event was widely covered by MONTSAME, news agency, six television channels (Mongolian National Public Television, Eagle, C1, UBS, TM, NTV) and Mongolian National Public Radio stations and 9 newspapers: Onoodor, Odriin Sonin, Ardyn Erkh, Ogloony Medee, Zuuny Medee, Mongolyn Medee, MONTSAME Daily News, Ulaanbaatar Times and UB Post. The news on the event also featured at the news

portal www.Gogo.mn, www.news.mn and news portal www.montsame.mn of MONTSAME and Mongol Messenger.

3.2.2 Distance Training for Journalists

A video training, “In case your professional rights are violated...” for the local media practitioners, was held on October 13-14, 2010 in the Distance Training Center at the Mongolian University of Science and Technology (MUST). The training was attended by a total of 86 journalists and media professionals of Zavkhan, Dundgobi, Ovorkhangai, Khentii, Darkhan-Uul, Orkhon, Dornogobi, Gobi-Altai, Dornod, Sukhbaatar, Tov and Bayankhongor provinces. The training introduced the new free expression violation self-alerting system and



other permanent channels accepting reports on cases and incidents against media and journalists. Lawyer D.Munkhburen educated the attendees on what is censorship and other types of the violations of the journalists professional rights. IT adviser, Ts.Taivanbaatar advised how to report on their professional rights' violations online and how to use the www.globeinter.org.mn/selfalerting website. Local journalists shared views and opinions on the media situation in their provinces and exchanged information

on crucial problems, and the abuse of powers of the local authorities and public officials.

3.2.3 Training for journalists “Journalist-Human Rights-UPR”

The training was held on April 12, 2011 at Puma Imperial Hotel and involved 24 journalists represented print and broadcast media based in Ulaanbaatar. The journalists educated on concepts of human rights, Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other international conventions and treaties accepted by Mongolia, and the UN human rights mechanisms, particularly what is UPR and why UPR. The journalists also informed in the NGO submissions and human rights issues focused by the NGO Forum of Mongolia. The journalists have signed the MEMO with Globe International to cover the UPR-related issues and events.

The training was a part of our project “Information and communication support the UN UPR” funded by the OSF, Mongolia.

3.2.4.Round-table: Media Legal Environment and Challenges

On November 19, 2010, Globe International NGO organized a round table discussion entitled “Media Legal Environment and Challenges” in the “A” hall of the “Khangarid” Palace of the Ulaanbaatar City Administration Office. The meeting was a part of the activities of a project “Enabling legal environment for a free and independent media” financed by the Asia Foundation of the USA.

The roundtable was moderated by Mr. B.Galaarid, Globe International Board Chairman. In total, 86 persons represented lawyers, public agencies, media and NGOs attended the round table.

The roundtable discussed the broader issues of the present situation of the media legal environment and the participants exchanged opinions on the important



laws omitted in Mongolia. The following presentations taken the round table:

- Broadcasting Regulation and Digital Tendency, Ch.Oyungerel, Communications Regulatory Commission

- TV Advertisement Market and Some Issues of Legal Regulation. Ya.Khishigsuren, MAXIMA Research Center
- New version of “Media Freedom Law,” G.Erdenebat, Law Adviser of the President

Issues of self-regulation, media responsibility and ethics, importance of the new regulation on media ownership transparency, training of lawyers and judges, capacity of the media NGOs, repealing criminal defamation and censorship were raised during the round table. The Participants also suggested Globe International to initiate the coordination of the working groups working on media and information related laws in order to come to the common understanding of the terminologies and the similar principles.

3.2.5.Public Screening of Human Right Documentaries

Globe International hosted the public screening of four human rights short documentaries produced to promote the UN UPR at Khan Bank theatre on October 07, 2010. In total, 43 representatives of NGOs, media and public attended the screening. It also showed a documentary titled Lies of Liberty that tells about the problems faced by LGBTB community of Mongolia.

The documentaries focused on the environmental and

3.2.6. Business Roaming

In the framework of Business Roaming project the following events were organized.

- **The training for new information brokers of BIA**

Globe International has expanded a network of information brokers who provide the local news and information for the Business Information Agency from 22 to 28. The training for six new info-brokers from Omnogvi and Dornogovi aimags was organized at the meeting room in “Bishrelt Plaza” hotel on 10 March, 2010. The number of info brokers of BIA reached 28. Training educated the participants on why information is important, how to run business in order to increase the family income and how to use internet and mobile phones to get information etc.

- **International conference**

Two-day international conference “Empowering rural business development through quality information and ICT – Central Asia/Mongolia” / “ICT for rural market development in Mongolia & Central Asia” was organized from 27 through 29 April, 2010. Over 100 people came from cities and provinces of Mongolia to



the conference and they represented herders, small and medium businesspersons, government officers, media and NGOs working in the field of rural development. Seven guests from Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, and China participated in the conference. Internews Europe was represented by Manana Aslamazyan, a director.

Mr. N.Enkhbold, Deputy Speaker of the Mongolian Parliament gave an opening speech in which he noted the importance of the ICT in development and the Mongolian government policy in developing of ICT, and welcomed the guests and participants of the conference. 25 presentations on the role and experiences of traditional and new media in rural development were taken during the plenary and parallel sessions and the participants discussed exchanged information and shared knowledge on global and regional perspective of using ICT innovation; mobile banking, SMS, IVR, website, blog, twitter etc.

- **Follow up meeting. Khentii aimag.**

On 15-16th of June, 2010, BIA team held a Follow up Meeting in Khentii aimag in Conference hall of Mongolbank in Undurkhaan city of Khentii aimag. In total, 26 SMEs, herders and government representatives participated at the meeting. Goals of the meeting were to evaluate the impact and results of the project and project activities including radio programs and others, exchanging ideas on future of the business roaming initiative, introduction of the activities of information brokers and local radio station cooperating with BIA and conducting survey on difficulties to be faced among local SMEs.

During the meeting participants evaluated the activity of the Business Roaming project, the production of BIA “Way of Success” and the BIA website www.bia.mn. SMEs of Khentii aimag encouraged the activity of BIA, expressed their will to cooperate with BIA and noted that the most necessary things in running their business are to be assisted in developing projects and to take a micro loan for business activities.

3.2.7 Capacity Building Training

As a part of the project “Transparency Campaigning at Local Government to Curb Corruption” from August 15, 2010 funded by the Partnership for Transparency Fund



(www.ptf.org) which aimed at improving the transparency of the local public organizations to curb corruption, we organized the following three events for the local communities of the project target soums: Guchin Us of Ovorkhangai aimag (Central region, 550 km from Ulaanbaatar) and Bayanhutag soum of Khentii aimag (Northern region, 353 km from Ulaanbaatar)

- **Community Workshops**

In Guchin-Us soum, of Ovorkhangai aimag the community workshops were held on 5-6 December

2010 and it involved 16 herders. In Bayankhutag soum of Khentii aimag it was held on 13-14 December 2010 and it involved 20 herders.

In total, 36 herders of two soums educated on ideas and concept of access to public information and role of freedom of information in curbing corruption and importance of transparent and good governance through two community workshops. As outputs of the workshops, the check list of the information need of the soums’ citizens and identified the effective information channels that the citizens prefer receiving information.

- **Training for the public officials**

The training was held on 4-5 December 2010 in Guchin-Us soum, of Ovorkhangai aimag and involved 27 public officials and in Bayankhutag soum of Khentii aimag it was held on 14-15 December 2010 and involved 30 public officials.

In total, 57 public officials of the two targeted soums gained knowledge on their duties to open up public information and how to best respond to the citizens’ requests. The public officials developed the check list of information to make accessible to the public and information channels that they prefer distributing to the citizens.

- **Monitoring Training**

Two monitoring trainings for total 12 monitoring team members held on 7 December in Guchin-Us soum of Ovorkhangai aimag and on 16 December in Bayankhutag soum of Khentii aimag. The monitoring team members gained skills on monitoring the implementation of the Government’s Resolution No143 on transparency indicators and public service at three public organizations in each soum.

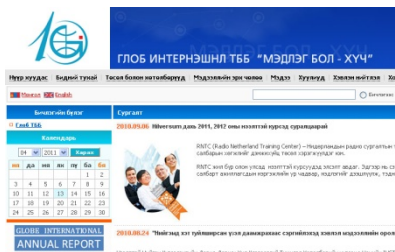

3.3.5 Local Radio Programming

Business Information Agency was established under Globe International and started own productions since March 2009. Three capacity building trainings for the BIA editorial staff were organized and conducted by the local and international trainers from Russia and India on radio production and online journalism, SMS writing.



BIA cooperates with 8 local radio stations and 20-minute radio programs titled “Way of Success” are aired by Noyon-Uul, OVorkhangai, Khuvsgul Waves, Khuvsgul, Next, Khovd, Orkhon 106,

Darkhan-Uul, Talyн Mongol, Dornod, Altai, Gobi-Altai and Gobi, Dolguun Kherlen, Kherlen and Gobi Wave, South Gobi. As of June 30, 2010 in total, 351 radio programs educating the rural business entrepreneurs and herders on business opportunities and new business ideas were aired.

180 local radio programs reached the target group from 1 January to June 30, 2010.

3.3.6 National Radio Programming

Since January 2009 Business Information Agency has been cooperating with the Mongolian National Public Radio to produce and air a weekly twenty-minute radio programs “Herder of Modern Area” that distributes

information to help the herders to improve their life quality. In total, 81 radio programs reached the listeners as of June 30, 2010.

25 national radio programs reached the target group from 1 January to June 30, 2010.

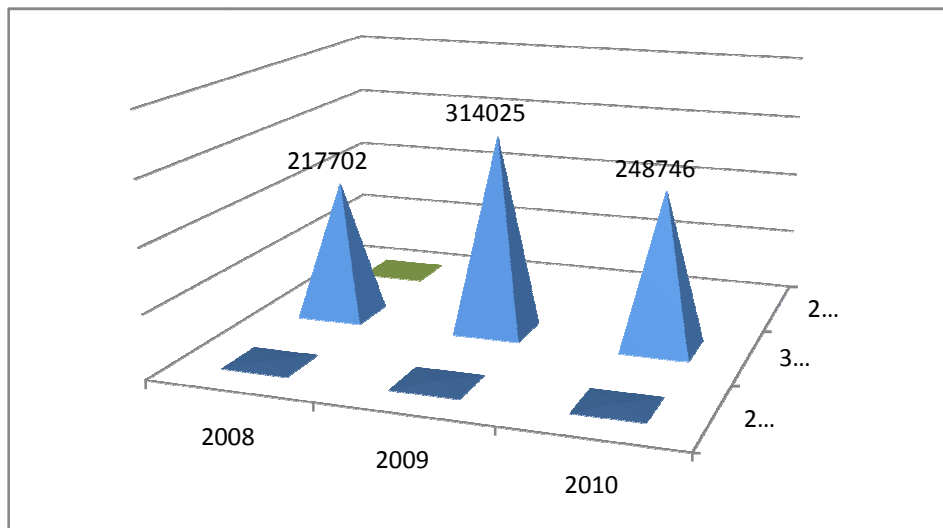
